

## **Practical Nursing Program**

**Application Packet** 



Thank you for your interest in the Practical Nursing Program at Highland Community College Technical Center!

The program starts in mid-August and goes through mid-May. Up to forty students are accepted into the program each year. Five college courses are required **BEFORE** you begin the PN program: BS 104: Human Anatomy and BS 105: Human Physiology (5 credits minimum w/ lab), PSY205: Human Growth and Development (3 credits), and ENG101: English I (3 credits).

Once you have successfully completed the program, you can apply for licensure as an LPN and register for the national licensure exam (NCLEX-PN). You may also plan to continue your education in the Highland Community College LPN to RN Completion Program. The LPN to RN Program usually takes an additional 2-3 semesters to complete prerequisites and advanced nursing courses.

The selection process for the Practical Nursing Program includes scores from the TEAS V and the WorkKeys test. These tests are offered by appointment only. Please call Highland Community College Technical Center at 785-442-6180 to schedule a test. Be prepared to spend 3 hours for the TEAS test and 2.5 hours for WorkKeys test. You will need to bring a photo ID. The TEAS test costs \$80.00, and there is a study guide available. WorkKeys testing costs \$30.00, and includes word problems to validate understanding of math concepts as well as reading comprehension. It is not possible to take both tests on the same day.

The following items are required to be considered for acceptance into the Practical Nursing Program:

- 1) An official high school or GED transcript to verify graduation from high school or its equivalent
- 2) An active CNA Certificate
- 3) Completion of the prerequisite courses with a grade of "C" or higher
- 4) Appropriate scores on the ATI TEAS and WorkKeys Exams
- 5) A letter of reference from your most recent employer mailed to Highland Community College Technical Center by the employer

Please refer to the "Practical Nursing Selection" page in this packet for more details on selection.

Highland Community College Technical Center has financial aid for those who qualify, including Pell Grants and Student Loans. If you need assistance with financial aid, please contact Allison Johnson (785-442-6206 or ajohnson@highlandcc.edu.)

All prerequisite courses and other requirements must be completed or in progress by the April 1 deadline each year.

### **Practical Nursing Selection**

Applicant's file must contain the following by April 1st in order to be qualified for an interview:

- 1. **Application for Admission** to Highland Community College at www.highlandcc.edu.
- 2. **Proof of graduation** from an accredited high school or GED program.
- **3. ATI TEAS:** Minimum composite score is 58.7%. Bring photo ID; arrive 15 minutes prior to start time with a picture ID; plan on 3+ hours; fee is \$80. Possible points 56-99.
- 4. **WorkKeys**: Minimum Math level = 5, Reading level=6. Plan on 2+ hours for these tests; fee is \$15 each test (\$30 total). A picture ID is required prior to testing.
- 5. Active CNA certification in Kansas or its equivalent if from another state.
- 6. **Program Application** and **Letter of Reference** (from most recent employer) both are provided in packet.
- 7. **Official** transcripts from **ALL** colleges attended. Transcripts must verify that a grade C or better was obtained for the following college courses:

BS 104: Human Anatomy BS 105: Human Physiology

PSY205: Human Growth and Development

**ENG101: Composition I** 

#### THE SELECTION PROCESS is POINT-DRIVEN:

When the applicant's file is complete (1-7 above), it is dated and points are evaluated by the Nursing Department staff. Applicants will then be scheduled for an interview. As part of the interview, applicants will be given points for punctuality, attire, and a writing sample. A point system is used to determine the best qualified applicants. Selected applicants will be sent a letter of acceptance to the PN program and be directed to obtain a criminal background check and take a drug screen test. These individuals must respond to their acceptance letter by the date provided on the letter. Failure to accept or reject the acceptance by the date provided will result in the loss of a position in the class.

Additional points awarded for the following: CNA > 6 months, CMA, College Algebra.

<u>Nursing applicants must be</u> 18 years old by graduation from the Practical Nursing program and able to perform the physical and mental activities required of nurses.

## **Testing Center Schedule**

<u>WorkKeys Assessments</u> - Usually given on Monday at 8:30am or Tuesday at 1:00pm (call ahead for an appointment.) All applicants planning to attend a Technical Center program must take the Reading and Math WorkKeys test prior to enrolling.

• \$15 per assessment; same charges apply for re-takes

<u>Accuplacer Assessment</u> - Call ahead for an appointment. All applicants to the CMA & EMT classes must take the Accuplacer Reading test. The placement test for Highland Community College Algebra classes is the Accuplacer Algebra test, and the placement test for English courses is the Accuplacer Writing test.

No charge for the 1<sup>st</sup> time; each additional appointment is \$25

<u>CNA Testing</u> - Appointments for HCC students are made by the class instructor. Out-of-state applicants and those retaking the test must apply to the Kansas Department of Aging and Disability Services. Contact Kimberly Garrett at 785-296-6958, or kimberly.garrett@ks.gov. Once the applicant has received permission to take the test from KDADS, he/she may call the Tech Center for an appointment.

• \$40 proctor fee for out-of state and those retaking the test

#### Nursing Entrance Test - ATI TEAS - by appointment

- \$80 for the TEAS test
  - TEAS Study Guides are available for purchase for \$35

When making your assessment appointment, please inform testing staff if you are, or ever were, on an Individual Education Plan (IEP) or if you qualified for Special Educational Services while attending K-12. If so, you may be eligible for special testing accommodations.

Test-takers must present a photo ID and a Receipt for the testing fees (payable in the main office of Building B) to the Testing Center coordinator on the scheduled assessment date. PLEASE ARRIVE AT THE TESTING ROOM 5 MINUTES BEFORE YOUR TESTING APPOINTMENT.

## WorkKeys Informational Guide

WorkKeys is a national system for teaching and assessing workplace skills that connects knowing with doing and learning with earning. WorkKeys is a national system enabling education and business to work together to strengthen achievement of workplace skills. All potential students seeking admission to Highland Technical Center will be tested using the WorkKeys Workplace Documents and Applied Math assessments.

Potential students are reminded that this is not a pass/fail test and that they are not competing against anyone. WorkKeys scores are reported on a scale from <3 to 7; Level 3 is the least complex and Level 7 is most complex. Level 3 is established at the point where a business would begin to show interest in assessing individuals.

**Workplace Documents:** 

35 multiple-choice questions that increase in difficulty. Test time is 55 minutes.

**Applied Math:** 

34 multiple-choice questions that increase in difficulty. Test time is 55 minutes. Students can bring their own calculator or a calculator will be provided to use when taking the Applied Mathematics assessment.

Potential students need to inform testing staff when making their assessment appointment if they are/were ever on an Individual Education Plan (IEP) or considered for Special Educational Services while attending K-12. These students will be given special time consideration.

Students scoring one level below or more will be advised to make arrangements with the HCCTC Learning Resource Center to help them improve their WorkKeys scores.

NOTE: Students may retake the Math or Reading tests as many times as they would like.

All students retaking a test will be charged a \$15.00 fee per test.

## REQUIRED IMMUNIZATIONS/SCREENINGS

The Highland Community College Nursing Program requires documentation from a provider of healthcare (physician's office, health department, lab, hospital, employer etc.) for the following immunizations before starting the nursing program.

- Hepatitis B BOTH of the following are required: 3 vaccinations AND positive antibody titer\*
  (lab report required). Series must be started by November 15 to have 2 doses completed by the
  first day of the nursing program.
- Influenza An annual vaccination given between October 1 December 31.
- MMR Measles, Mumps, Rubella One of the following is required: 2 vaccinations OR positive antibody titer for all 3 components (lab report required).
- TB Skin Test TST (Mantoux or PPD) One of the following is required after May 15 of the year the student enters the Practical Nursing program (August 15 for the LPN to RN program):
  - Negative two-step TB skin test procedure within the last year; second test must have been read within 48-72 hours after the first was read
  - > Two (2) negative TB skin tests in the past two years
  - Negative QuantiFERON Gold Blood Test (IGRA)
  - If you have a positive TB test contact the Nursing Department immediately for further requirements. You may need to get a QuantiFERON Gold Blood Test (IGRA) and a chest X-ray. If the chest X-ray is positive, you must complete medical treatment and be released to attend the nursing program.
- Tetanus, Diphtheria & Pertussis 1 Tdap vaccination as an adult since 2005; then Td booster within the last 10 years
- Varicella One of the following is required: 2 vaccinations OR positive antibody titer (lab report required)
- COVID-19 Many facilities that the HCC Nursing Department uses for clinical sites do require
  the COVID-19 vaccine. If you are not fully vaccinated and alternate clinical sites are unavailable,
  you will not be able to attend clinical. This will affect your grade in those courses. Failure to
  complete any courses with the minimum required grade will be cause for dismissal from the
  program.

Discuss with your physician any other immunizations which maybe in your best interest such as pneumonia, Hepatitis A, human papilloma virus (Gardacil) etc.

\*A titer is a test of blood that indicates whether or not you are immune to a disease. Titers can be done for hepatitis B, MMR and varicella if you are unsure of your immunization status.

Students <u>must</u> maintain personal health insurance coverage for the duration of the program. Please provide proof of insurance.

### Legal Qualifications for LPN Licensure

Admission to the HCC Practical Nursing Program <u>does not guarantee</u> graduation from the program, and graduation from the program <u>does not guarantee</u> eligibility to take the practical nursing licensure exam (NCLEX-PN).

Before graduation from the program you must submit a written application to the state board of nursing for licensure. The Kansas State Board of Nursing (KSBN) may deny a license to practice nursing as a licensed practical nurse if the applicant has been guilty of a felony or guilty of a misdemeanor involving an illegal drug offense unless the applicant has shown sufficient rehabilitation to warrant the public trust, except that no license shall be granted to a person with a felony conviction of a crime against persons as specified in Article 34 of Chapter 21 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated and acts amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto. Also considered are patterns of practice and to other behaviors exhibiting an apparent incapacity to practice nursing as described in 65-1120 in the Kansas Nurse Practice Act.

All criminal history must be revealed to and will be evaluated by KSBN before licensure is granted or denied. This information is pertinent to KSBN only. If you are planning to seek licensure in a different state, please check with the Board of Nursing in the state to which you plan to apply.

## Disclosure of Criminal Background/Substance Abuse

Clinical affiliates may require criminal background checks and drug/alcohol screens of all students to maintain patient safety. If selected to the practical nursing program, you must consent to a background check to disclose any felony or misdemeanor convictions. Upon admission you will receive detailed information about how to proceed with the background checks and drug screens. Students in the HCC Practical Nursing program are also required to have routine, random drug screens. Students must report directly to HCC's Business Health provider when selected for a drug screen. Additional requirements or disclosures may become necessary during the program. Non-compliance with all mandates may result in termination from the program. Late or incomplete records may result in dismissal from clinical (with unexcused absence) or dismissal from the program if documents are not produced in full as required. Findings on the background check or drug screen may prohibit a student from participating in clinical rotations; and, would therefore prevent progression in or completion of the program.

## **Health Policy**

Students are required to obtain and maintain health insurance coverage for the duration of the program. Students should be aware that they may be in close contact with individuals having a wide variety of health problems in which the cause may not be known. It is the student's responsibility to follow program guidelines for precautions against contracting and transmitting diseases. The student is responsible for all healthcare costs (physical, immunizations, diagnostics, titers, etc.) associated with the program. **Progression in the practical nursing program will be contingent upon satisfactorily meeting the health requirements.** Health restrictions may prohibit a student from participating in clinical rotations which include the provision of total patient care; and, would therefore prevent progression in or completion of the program.



### **Instructions for International Students Pertaining to Nursing Programs**

Special considerations apply for applicants to the Practical Nursing and/or LPN to RN Completion Programs who were born and/or educated in countries other than the United States.

#### HCC INTERNATIONAL STUDENT APPLICANT

For purposes of admission, international applicants are defined as all persons who are not citizens nor permanent residents of the United States. An international applicant must meet a number of specific requirements. General information about these requirements can be found at:

Note: All documentation must be submitted at least <u>three months prior</u> to the beginning of the semester for which application is being made.

#### Students interested in nursing must also be aware of the following:

- If you do not have a Social Security number, you may not be licensed to work in some states.
- The Kansas State Board of Nursing will only consider coursework completed outside of the United States after it has been evaluated by the Commission on Graduates of Foreign Nursing Schools (CGFNS) <a href="https://www.cgfns.org">www.cgfns.org</a>
- English Proficiency Requirements One of the following must be met:
  - TOEFL score of at least 500 on paper based test or 173 on computer based test or at least 61 on Internet based test
  - o Official IELTS score of 4.5
  - o Official TOEIC score of 525
  - o Official PTE score of 33 or higher

- o A minimum of 12 U.S. college credit hours with a grade D or higher (including a college level English course)
- o Completion of a minimum of 15 weeks in an approved Intensive Language Center
- o Submit high school transcripts reflecting completion of one academic year of study in the United States
- Applicants applying for federal and/or other types of financial aid will be required to submit non-U. S. transcripts for financial aid purposes
- Individuals presently in the United States who do not currently hold a lawful immigration status need to be aware that a background check is required.
  - Those who have not been granted Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals
     (DACA) authorization may have difficulty providing the documentation needed to complete the background check.
  - o Students who are DACA approved should not assume their DACA approval guarantees they will pass a background check.
  - o If a clinical affiliate requires proof of eligibility for work authorization, those who are DACA approved may be asked to present their valid "Employment Authorization Document", valid US state driver's license, or valid passport.
